Dear Miss Guy:

In a recent meeting of Beatty Hall men with Dean Rozell, it was suggested we could write to you about a problem which we fell should be dealt with.

Today as men of God are proclaiming from our pulits the decline and decay of our national morality, we believe Northwest College should lead the way in the battle for honor and decency. We fell Christians should stand for holiness today more than ever before. Rather than conforming to the world "for the sake of relevance", we, as Christian young people, should seek to exalt the name of Jesus, our Master, by living holy and presentable before Him in this Godless, degenerated world. Romans 12:1,2.

Specifically, the problem which concern us immediately is the immodest manner of dress which is evidenced on campus by so many of the women students. We fell short dresses, tight pants, and pants dresses are not only distasteful, but bring dishonor to the name of Christ. The manner of indecent dress by many of the young ladies is offensive to us as men. But most important we believe it brings reproach to our Lord.

We request you to do everything within your power to correct this unfortunate situation which has developed on campus. We ask you to help lift the standard of decency here at Northwest.

Gentlemen:

Your letter to both Mrs. Flisram and myself, expressing concern about Women's Dress Code infractions came on Friday afternoon, and was carefully considered.

Although you men are not aware of what is being done to correct individuals, possibly there is more we can do. I assure you this matter is close to my heart, so I thank you for your concern.

Perhaps there is something we can do together, that is, in addition to praying, I mean. First, let me say that I would hope you fellows have specific individuals in mind as we cannot pursue a complaint through judgments based on generalizations. When there are persons observed to be disregarding the dress code they are referred to their Residence Council and then to the deans. Would you give us a list so that we can look into the matter.

Recent changes have been made in the Women's Dress Code. But the principal of being modest and Christian in appearance was considered important by the Student committee to maintain. The dress length is as stated in the Student Handbook. Apparel that is too short or tight-fitting is considered immodest. Therefore, the problems you mentioned in the letter are relevant. Your objection to pant dresses is something I wondered about. For two years these have been included in the dress code as permissible for casual wear. There is one problem with pant dresses which I have observed. Because of their design, the manufacturers do not make them so that they can be altered to a longer length. So because girls cannot buy pant dresses and alter them they are often too short. The divided skirt is their only redeeming feature.

There is another thought I will include in this letter of response. Where you men observe girls who do not dress modestly, there are several things you could do to help them. You might even consider "boycotting" them in dating. You could chat with them from a man's viewpoint. Then if they could be referred by you to the Women's Residence Council they would be further advised or disciplined.

We must each one do his part to uphold all the Christian Standards upon which Northwest College is founded. No one individual can do everything.
