In each case there is a professional contribution which these courses can make to the C. E. Minister. These courses may NOT be used for courses making up a Christian Education minor or for the supporting course requirement of C.E. in other majors of the Division. The latter must be in central core subject-matter in Christian Education per se, (i.E. courses which bear a primary C.E. prefix in the numbering system.)
