FINAL EXAMINATIONS:
Students enrolled for the Spring Quarter must consider their commitment to complete the quarter on campus up through the published dates of the quarter. The quarter will continue in session until Wednesday, May 31 (or until finals are completed during finals week.)
Early exams for purposes of employment, weddings, or other personal reasons will not be granted. Students considering such purposes to be of greater importance than : finals will need to make a choice, and to assume appropriate responsibility for the choice.
The College has gone to considerable lengths to abbreviate the terminus oint of the academic calendar in order to accommodate summer employment for the benefit of all students. The means and purpose of this effort will have been frustrated if early exams are permitted except in clear-cut and documented cases of emergency or reasons of health.
The final exam requirement, of course, does not apply to graduating seniors or to graduating sophomores for the current year.
