CLASS ATTENDANCE:

The policy for class attendance has been changed and will differ from the information found in the Student Handbook. All students should be aware of this change. It is as follows:

"No specific number of 'cuts' from class is authorized. In no instance shall a student be given a passing grade in a course in which he is absent more than two weeks of class meetings during the quarter (except in cases of extended illness or comparable emergency as determined by the Dean of Education and the instructor involved). All absences will be evaluated by the instructor, and in all cases the student is responsible for course work missed. Tardiness will be evaluated by the instructor."

"For purposes of determining enrollment status after one week of consecutive absences from school or from a class, a student will be subject to removal from the class rolls unless he notifies the instructor or Dean of intent to continue in the class or classes involved. However, until such time that a student officially withdraws from a course or from college, he is subject to the college attendance policy even though he may have discontinued attendance." (Withdrawals may be made anytime up through the last day of the quarter.)

"Absences on instructional days immediately before and after holidays will be counted as double absences, except in cases of illness or extreme emergency. Any request for considering the absence as a single absence only must be submitted in writing to the Dean of Education."
