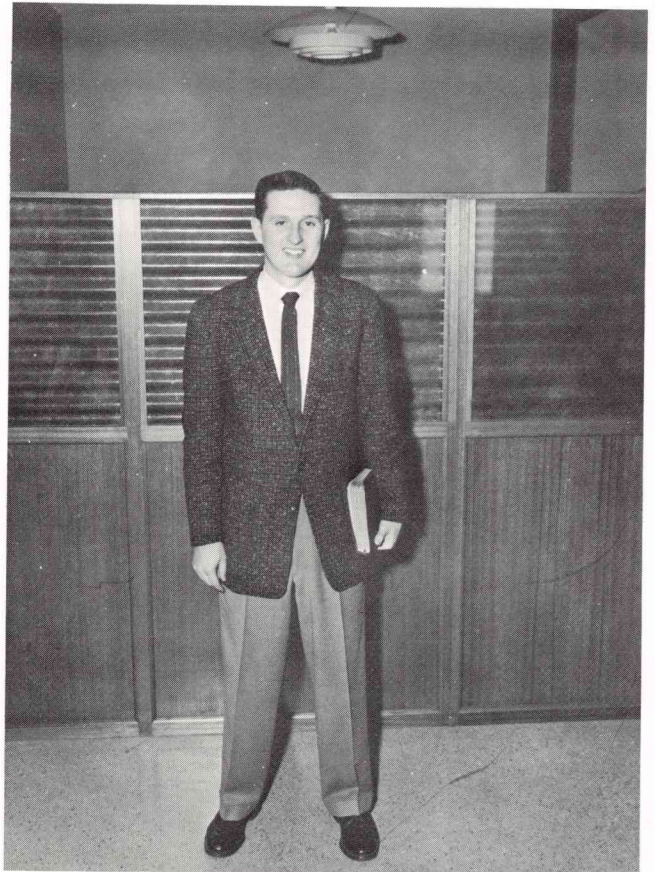
Mr. Peter Ahlstrom is the Librarian at N.B.C. and is a graduate of the College.
