
#### "HITHERTO HATH THE LORD LED US"


After considering the matter of a fitting dedication for the Karisma of 1958-59, the staff has come to the conviction that it must give thanks to God for the Miracle He has wrought in providing the new site for the Northwest Bible College. It has become evident that it is impossible to find any one individual who has been chiefly responsible for all that has been done. Many have invested tireless effort and willing cooperation and are worthy of any honor the staff of this yearbook could give. The Board of Directors, the President, the Assistant to the President, the faculty, the Campus Commission, the students, with alumni and friends; all have shared in this great work.

The Convention of the Northwest District Council of the Assemblies of God, as it met in Everett, Washington, in 1945, passed a resolution that a permanent site be sought to house the Northwest Bible College. The President of our College prepared on application and presented it to the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, hoping that a portion of what was then the Stewart Heights Housing Project might be awarded to

N.B.C. A deadline was set at which time the School was to demonstrate the financial ability to develop the property. An extension of time was later received, with the understanding that this date would be met with the necessary funds asked for by the Government in order to show financial responsibility. The Campus Commission came to the forefront in raising the required funds. After a period of patient and prayerful waiting the word was received that the Northwest Bible College had been awarded twenty-two acres on which to erect the new buildings. The College also secured an adjoining plot of over twelve acres, bringing the total size of the new campus to just under thirtyfive acres. Construction is now under way on this site. What has brought this to pass? The endeavors of these men would be fruitless without the prayers and diligent intercession of the interested friends throughout our churches. We are seeing the answer to these prayers unfolding before our eyes. The beginning is behind us and the future lies bright because this Miracle, once hoped for, is becoming a reality.

To Thee, O God; the God of Time and Eternity, the God of Miracles, we offer our heartfelt praise.

ual life of the college. Some of these students are themselves the products of missionary work, and all are now preparing themselves for greater service among their own people.




We feel our team exhibited, at all times, the finest quality of sportsmanship. Without a doubt our sports program has aided the players in developing well-balanced Christian lives.






# **RECREATION**




# OUR COLLEGE BOOKSTORE




## MATRICULATION


