FINANCIAL IMPACT QUESTIONNAIRE:

Due to information just received in a memorandum from the Office of Washington Friends of Higher Education, those students who have not yet submitted a completed financial impact questionnaire need not do so.

FINANCIAL AID:

Apply early - Any student needing financial aid next year, National Direct Student Loans, Supplemental Opportunity Grant, College Work Study, should make application now. Arrange an interview with the Financial Aids Officer for information and applications.

YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE:

You may be eligible for a grant. Any student from a low income family who began his college education since April 1, 1973 may be eligible for a Basic Educational Opportunity Grant. Application forms to determine eligibility are available from the Financial Aids Office.

WORK OPPORTUNITY:

The College has received some additional funds for the Work Study Program, for on-campus employment through June 30. Total hours of employment would be limited to 15 per week during school and 40 hours per week during June. Eligibility is determined from information on the Parents or Student's Confidential statement for those who applied for Federal Aid. If this statement indicated eligibility for loans or grants, the student would be eligible for work-study employment. Those interested and qualifying should contact Mr. Hodges.
