ACT TESTING:

A residual testing with the ACT (American College Tests) will be scheduled for 8:00 a.m. Saturday, April 12. Admissions tests (ACT, SAT, or WCPT) are required of all students entering the College effective this year (unless they are transferees presenting at least 36 quarter credits in transfer). Students taking the ACT tests on April 12 must register for them in advance at the Registrar's Office in Bronson Hall.

STUDENT PREACHING EMPHASIS:

There is to be a student preaching emphasis in Chapel on April 28, 30, and May 1. The three students who will preach on those days will be chosen in preaching tryouts on the evening of April 21 beginning at 7:00 p.m. From the three chosen to speak in chapel one will be selected as winner to receive a trophy.

The tryouts are open to both men and women students. Participants must have had at least one course in Speech and Homiletics with a grade of C or better and must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better.

The tryout sermons should be about 12 minutes in length. A manuscript of the sermon should be submitted to the Academic Dean's office no later than April 18. The judges will consider oratorical ability, structure and content of the sermon (with heavy emphasis in Biblical content), interpretation of the text, appearance and bearing of the preacher, and evidence of inspiration or anointing in selecting the winners.

We urge students whose goal is a preaching minor to consider participating in this student preaching emphasis. See Dean Rice if there are further questions.
