STUDENT ACCOUNTS:

ATTENTION DRIVERS:

The College Vehicle Code is intended for the convenience, security, and safety of all. It is being enforced now and applies to all students who own or operate a vehicle -- car, pick-up, truck, or motor bike. With over 400 vehicles on campus, strict compliance is essential. Citations are issued when a violation occurs. The following conditions prevail as to enforcement of the code:

- A. Citations may be challenged within 48 hours at the Dean of Students Office.
 - B. Fines will be paid in cash within seven (7) days.
 - C. Fines not paid in seven days will be added to the student's account with a surcharge.
 - D. Three citations within one quarter will result in automatic disciplinary action.
 - E. Vehicles illegally parked may be towed away at the driver's expense.
- Please consult the code as received when you registered. If you have questions or special concerns, consult the Dean of Students Office.

ATTENTION, ALL STUDENTS:

Policy requires that students pay cash for their books and supplies. The only ones who should apply for an exception to this are those who receive a Federal Aid or Loan award which covers the cost of their books.

PING PONG -- OPEN PLAY IN GYM:
