Students wishing to participate should submit manuscripts of their sermons to the Academic Dean no later than April 21 and be prepared to preach for the Judging Committee at 7:00 p.m. on April 29 in the college chapel. Sermons should be approximately 15 minutes in length. From those who enter sermons, the committee will choose up to three to participate in chapels during the spring quarter.
