STUDENT ACCOUNTS:

Student accounts are now due in full and must be cleared before finals. If an appointment with the Business Manager is necessary, act now, as the time schedule will be full later in the month.

EARLY REGISTRATION:

Reservations and appointments for in-line registration next Fall (September 20) may be made now in the Registrar's office on a first-come basis. Those not making reservations at the counter may do so in the chapel after May 15. The reservations form automatically covers space for enrollment and for housing. Early appointments should be made only if a student has serious plans to return to campus next fall.

We are reordering stocks on the CLEP tests for testing up through the month of June. Present minimum scores for College credit are those recommended by the American Council of Education; however, most institutions in the State of Washington require a higher score, and it would be likely that the College's required scores will be brought up to those followed by most Washington College/Universities effective next fall.
