

THANKSGIVING DAY - If you live in the dorm and have no where to go on Thanksgiving, see your R.A. or Resident Counselor.

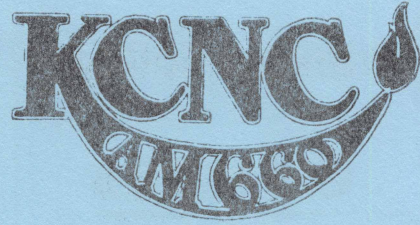
