On-Campus Parking - Effective Monday, March 28, traffic personnel will be checking vehicles for proper parking and traffic tickets will be issued for violations.

The College Vehicle Code is intended for the convenience, security and safety of all. It applies to all students who own or operate a vehicle. With over 400 vehicles on campus, strict compliance is essential. Citations are issued when a violation occurs. The following conditions prevail as to enforcement of the code:

1. Citations may be challenged within 48 hours at the Dean of Students Office.
2. Fines will be paid in cash within 7 days.
3. Fines not paid in 7 days will be added to student's account with a surcharge.
4. Three citations within one quarter will result in automatic disciplinary action.
5. Vehicles illegally parked may be towed away at the owners expense.

BOOKS - Policy provides for students to pay cash for their books at the bookstore. Only exceptions are for those who have federal aid awards which cover their books or students whose accounts are covered by Rehabilitation.
