VETERANS! For purposes of Veterans payments, the following scale will qualify taking summer school courses here at N.C.:

Four credits - Full time
Three credits - Three-quarters time
Two credits - One-half time

This means that a veteran student taking four or more credits in summer school will get full-time benefits for the summer session.
