"Nervous" is when you approach the annual business meeting without adequate records and have to respond with "I don't know," when asked about how many were saved in the spring revival last year.

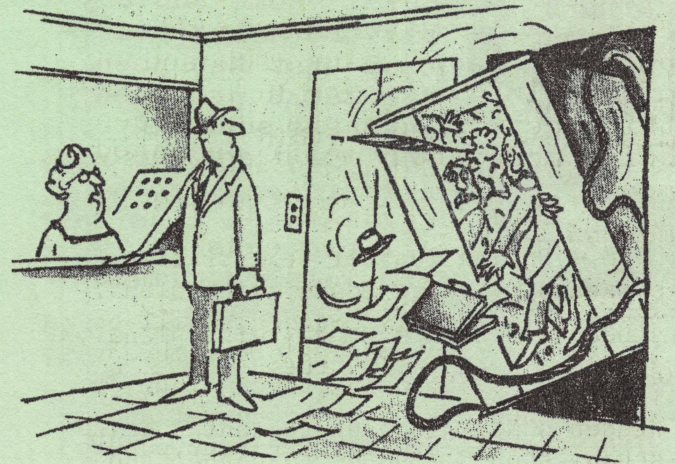
"Nervous" is when the board asks you what your plans are for promoting the church this year, and you say, "Well, brethren, God will promote us."
