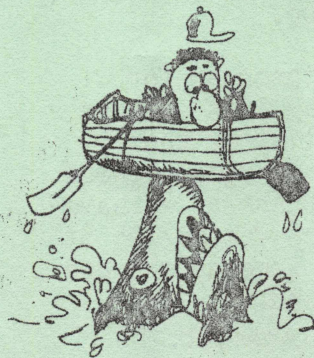
ENGAGED COUPLES' SEMINAR - May 13 - Sat.
