MEASLES --RUBEOLA (red measles) -- There is evidence of a possible epidemic of measles in King County, primarily affecting students from junior high through college.

The Public Health Dept., 15607 N.E. Bell-Red Rd., Bellevue, 747-1760, is recommending measles vaccine if:

1. You have never had the measles.
2. You do not have record of exact day, mth year the vaccine was given.
3. You were given the vaccine before 1 yr. of age or before 1968.

This disease is highly contagious and can cause serious complications.
