
WE NEED HELP! Friday and Sat. the Lay Council will be on Campus. . . Efforts are being made to have the grounds and buildings ready for our guests.

The Public Health Dept., 15607 N.E. Bell-Red Rd., Bellevue, 747-1760, is recommending measles vaccine if:

1. You have never had the measles.

You do not have record of exact day, mth year the vaccine was given.

You were given the vaccine before 1 yr. of age or before 1968.

This disease is highly contagious and can cause serious complications.
