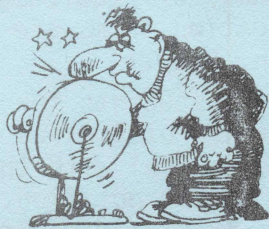

STUDENT ACCOUNTS ARE NOW DUE AND FINALS CAN NOT BE TAKEN UNLESS THE ACCOUNT IS PAID IN FULL. The deadline is May 23. This applies to ALL students.

Don't have the money? We can help!

Arrangements have been made with a local bank to extend a short term (120 day) loan to NC students in the amount needed to clear their unpaid balance, thus clearing the student for finals. Repayment of the loan is made directly to the bank.

If you need this service, contact the Office of the Business Manager for the necessary forms. This process should be initiated by May 15.

This will give time to clear the deadline of May 23 -- act now!

SUMMER SCHOOL enrollment requires that all previous accounts be paid in full and the payment for summer school charges is due the first day of classes. There is no arrangement for deferred pay of summer school account.

SUMMER SCHOOL REGISTRATIONS are now in process. You can gain up to ten credits (two-thirds of a normal quarter's work) in only four weeks' time. Dates: June 4-29

Rev. U Myo Chit, District Superintendent of the Assemblies of God in Burma will be speaking. He is the pastor of the Assembly of God church in Rangoon, which numbers more than 800 adults. His great-great-grandfather was the second Protestant convert in Burma. He was educated in England, and was a lay minister until western missionaries were evacuated from Burma in 1966. At that time he was chosen to assume a role of leadership in the Assemblies of God. He has recently conducted evangelistic tours. In one area 36 new congregations were established. Come hear him relate the story of church growth and revival in Burma.
