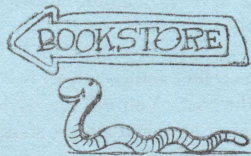

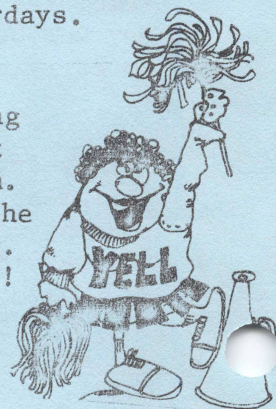
##### Intramural Volleyball (Girls):
