October 23, in Chapel is A.S.B. "International Day." The speaker will be Donald Christie.

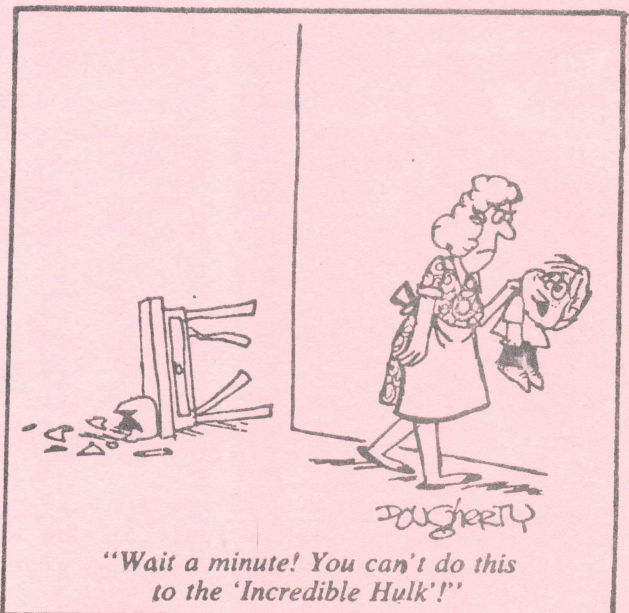
