Attention all B.A. Graduates--If you have not filled out the "Placement Questionnaire for Seniors," please come in the Registrar's Office and fill one out as soon as possible

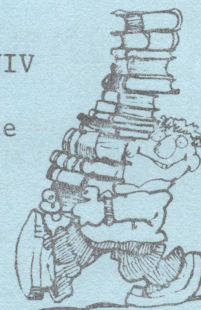
