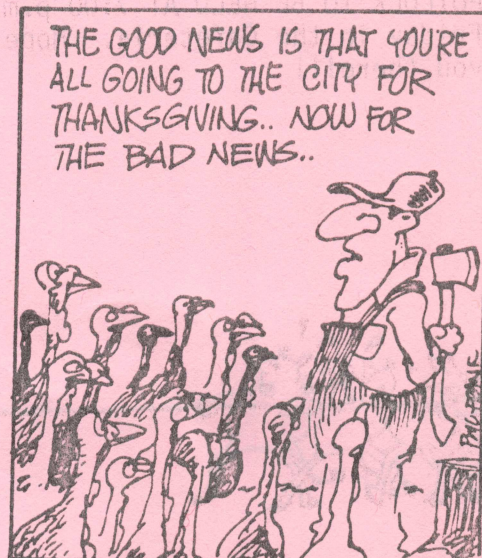
Students - start thinking now about your
