Effective Jan. 1, 1982 only earned scholarships will be considered part of the down payment for student accounts. This would include such awards as Summer Intern, P.R. Teams, R.A.'s A.S.B. Officers, Karisma. Non-earned scholarships or discounts will not be considered part of the required down payment. These include Minister's/Missionary/Child-Discounts, Teen Talent Awards, and Freshman Scholarships. As of that date gift scholarships will be applied to the student accounts separate from the down payment requirements.
