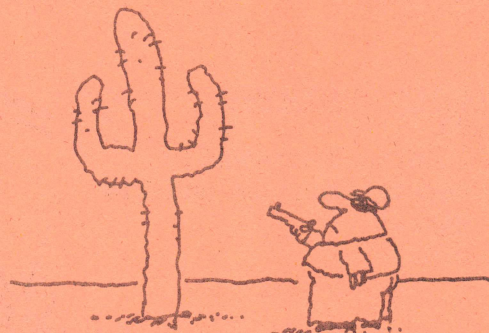

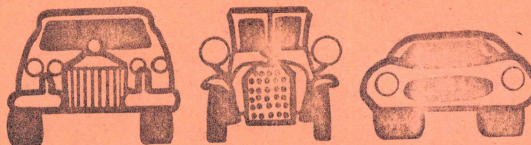

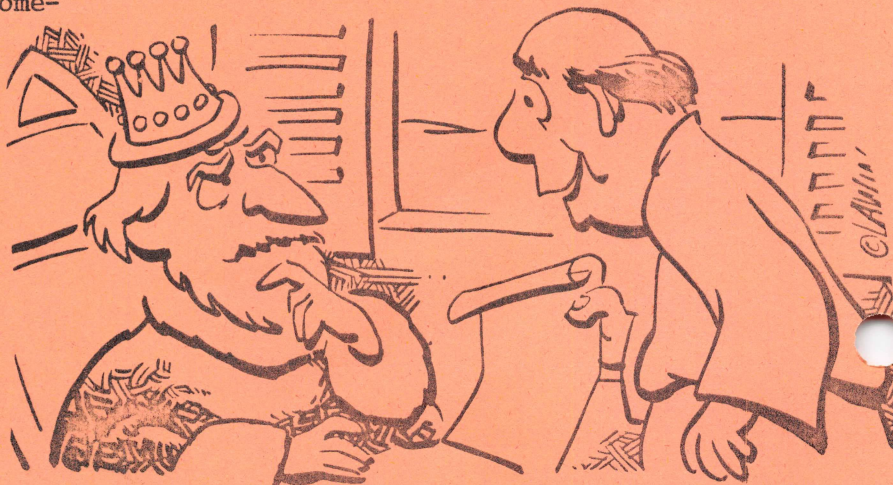
Parking... Thanks to all who are cooperating in the matter of campus parking.
