Payment of Accounts

All accounts are due in full on the first day of classes, otherwise a deferred payment plan must be on file in the Business Office.

Book Policy

Book purchases are on a cash basis. The exception to this rule is for those students on Rehabilitation or those carrying a credit balance on their account.

Official Withdrawl from Classes:

- 1. Process the forms provided by the Registrar's office. Refund policy applies only to those who have officially
- 2. Students in the residence halls must also check out with the Resident Dean before leaving.

Refund Policy stands as follows:

- 1. When a student reduces his load but does not withdraw from college, tuition will not be adjusted after the Friday of the first full week of classes.
 - 2. Fees are non-refundable.
- 3. Tuition will be refunded on the following scale:

80% during first week of classes

60% during second week 40% during third week

20% during fourth week (no refunds after fourth week).

Next week the J.V. Team has three ball games. Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 6:30 in the gym. Come on out!


J.V. and Varsity practice to be held Monday March 24, at 2:30 p.m.
