Payment of Accounts

All accounts are due in full on the first day of classes, otherwise a deferred payment plan must be on file in the Business Office.

Book Policy

Book purchases are on a cash basis. The exception to this rule is for those students on Rehabilitation or those carrying a credit balance on their account.

Official Withdrawl from Classes:

1. Process the forms provided by the Registrar's office. Refund policy applies only to those who have <u>officially</u> withdrawn.

2. Students in the residence halls must also check out with the Resident Dean before leaving.

Refund Policy stands as follows:

- 1. When a student reduces his load but does not withdraw from college, tuition will not be adjusted after the Friday
- of the first full week of classes.
- 2. Fees are non-refundable.

3. Tuition will be refunded on the following scale:

- 80% during first week of classes
- 60% during second week
- 40% during third week

20% during fourth week (no refunds) after fourth week).
