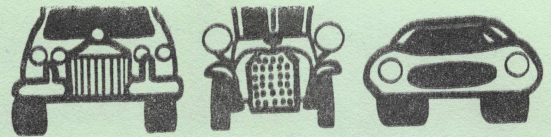

Work-Witness Opportunity for summer for 25 students from Northwest at Hall's Crossing Resort & Marina, Blanding Utah. Rate of \$3.10 per hour - 8 hours per day, 6 days per week. Position include Gas Dock and Housekeeping on Houseboat and Motel units. Living conditions are on a Bunkhouse basis with the boys having a cook and the girls cooking for themselves. Rooms are on a cost basis at 50¢ to \$1.00 per day per person. Meal costs are from the menu and/or store and should be in the area of \$5.00 to \$6.00 per day.
