STUDENTS WHO MISSED THE BASIC YOUTH CONFLICTS EXAM must sign up for a make-up time with the Registrar's Office.

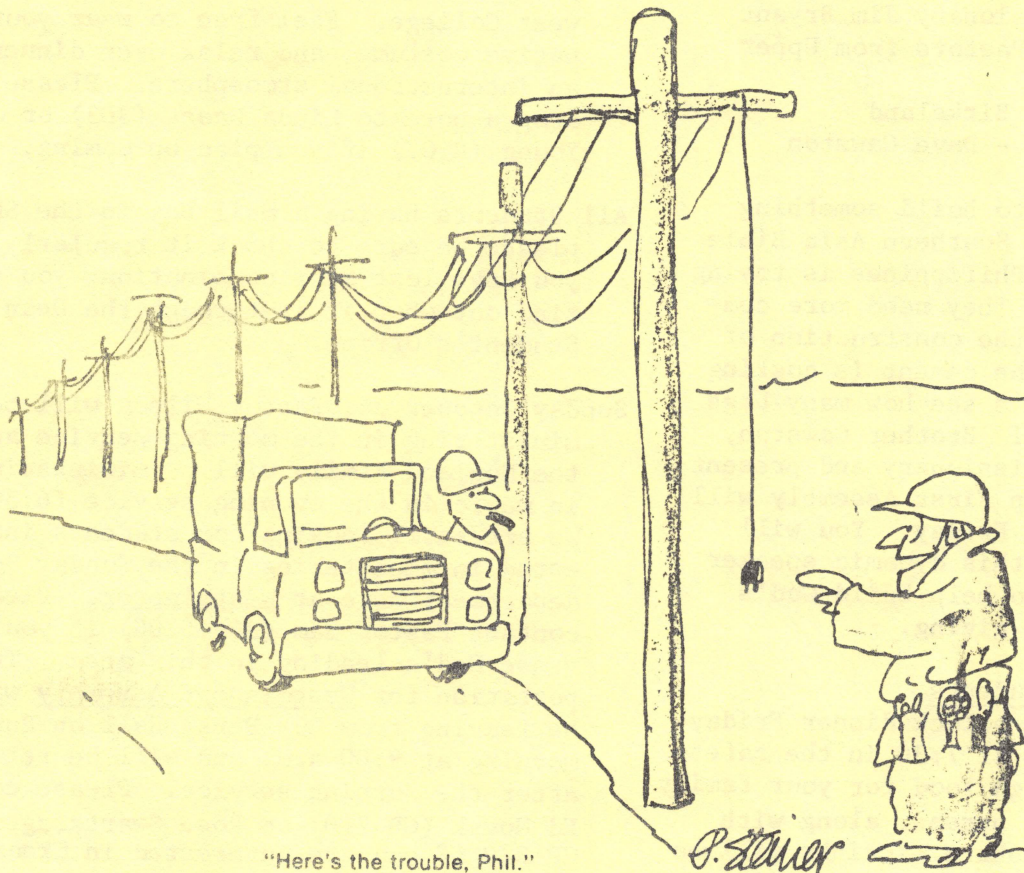
