The first half of the Men's Intramural Football season is over. The standings are as follows:

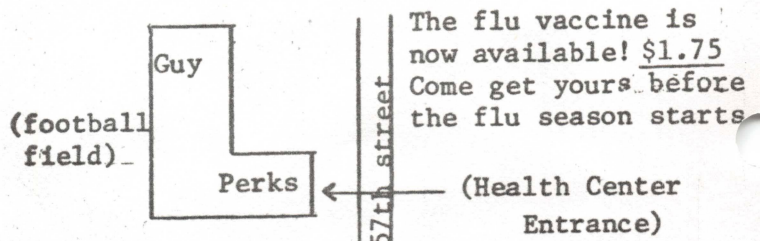
