A RUN FOR THE HUNGRY JOG-A-THON is scheduled

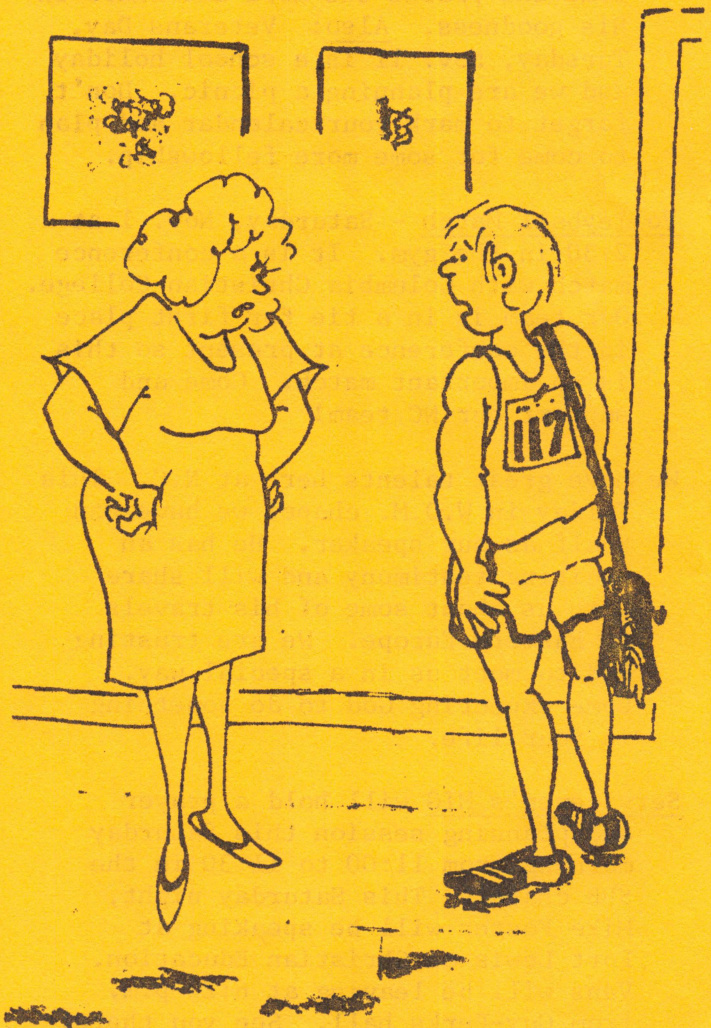
