A copy of the student's billing statement for spring quarter has been mailed to the parents of students for those who requested this service. This is only a statement of the actual charges for spring quarter as they are at the time of registration. Students receiving financial assistance from their parents should communicate with them regarding their spring quarter account.

COURSE FEE CHANGE: Effective spring quarter students requesting a change of course should pay the \$2 course fee charge to the cashier and present the receipt of payment to the personnel in the Registrar's Office. Students not paying the \$2 cash fee but requesting it to be applied to their account (charge or credit) will be assessed \$5.

Accounts that were not paid in full by the close of the business day March 19, are subject to 8% carrying charge. 4% will be reversed for accounts paid March 20-April 17 inclusive. After April 17 no carrying charges will be reversed. This carrying charge is applicable to all balances except those involving federal aid awarded by Northwest College.
