#### SUMMER INSTITUTE ON SCIENTIFIC CREATIONISM

Most of you are aware that we will be having three men from the Institute for Creation Research here for a one week seminar June 8-12. The sessions are held during the day, which creates problems for those enrolled in regular summer school classes or those working days. We have received permission to video-tape these sessions and show them in the evening of the same week. Sessions will run from 6:30-10:30 Monday through Friday, and from 9-5 on Saturday. It is planned that one of the ICR men will be there to answer questions. Charges will be the same, \$95 for just the seminars, \$135 total if you want the 3 credits. You can receive 3 science credits even if you already have taken the theories of Evolution course at N.C. This is a unique opportunity to hear some internationally known men, so try to work it in your schedule if at all possible.

Banquet Cost: All full time students and those who paid the spring quarter banquet fee are FREE. Others, such as part time students or guests, the fee is \$14.

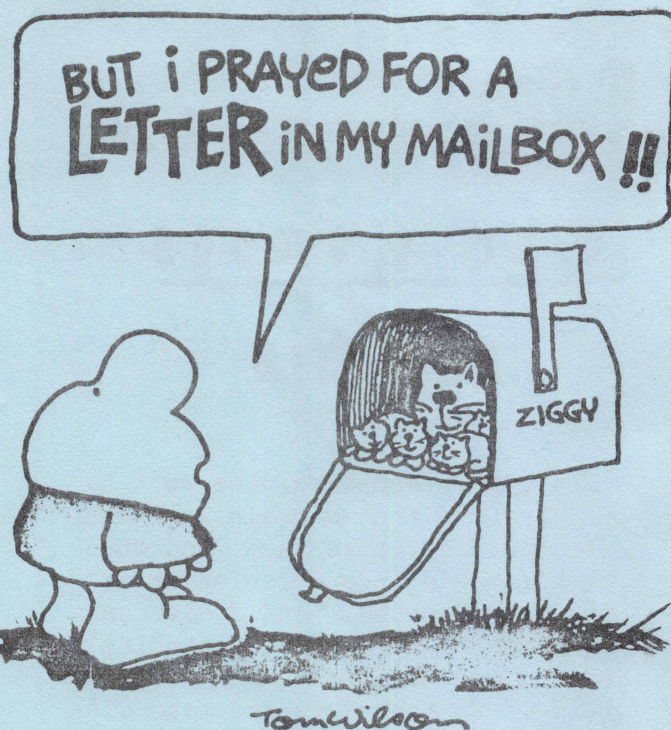

## BEOG FOR 1981-82

Many of you have applied for a Basic Grant and have not yet heard from them whether or not you are eligible. Because of President Regan's budget cuts, a final decision has not been made regarding the total funding for Basic Grants next year. Therefore, no BEOG applications have been processed yet. CSS has processed all FAFs sent to them but no BEOG eligibility has yet been determined for any student. The notice sent to you by CSS is regarding only the FAF analysis, not BEOG eligibility. You should expect to start receiving notification by mid to late May (or so the Financial Aid Officer fervently hopes!)

Taylor Johnson Temperament Analysis and Strong-Campbell Interest Inventory test results are now available for any students who took these tests given by the Counseling Department during orientation for fall, winter, or spring quarter this year.
