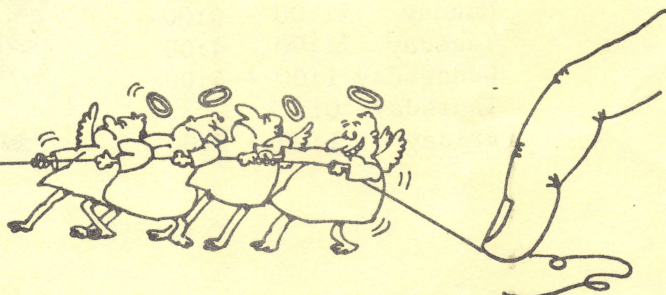

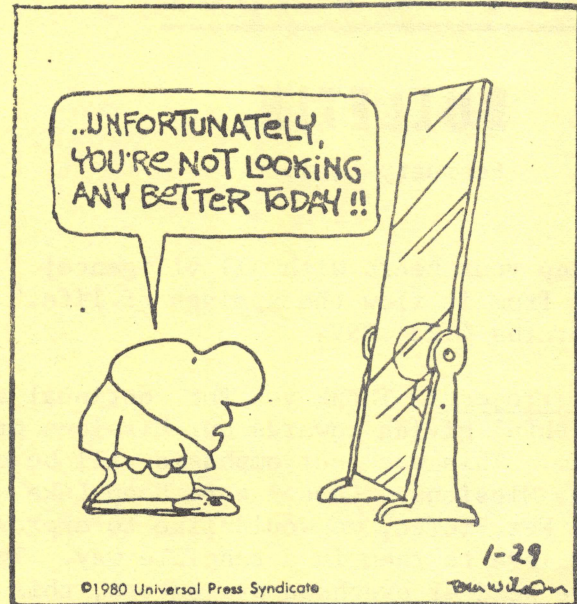

A new course, entitled the Minister's Wife, will be offered on Tuesday evenings, 6:30-8:15 p.m. in the spring quarter. The class will meet in L-101 (or in L-1 if enrollment demands) and will offer 2 credits. It will be coordinated by Professor Braddy with the help of several outside speakers. There will not be any exams as it will be taught on a seminar level. Collateral reading and brief papers will be required as far as grading is concerned. This course is designed to assist in understanding the role of a minister's wife. Subjects to be covered in the course will include learning to deal with feelings, learning to relate to women in the church, learning to establish priorities, and learning to adjust to the ministry and its demands on the minister.
