STUDENT ACCOUNTS:

Arrangements have been made with a local bank for students to take out a short-term loan to cover any unpaid balance from the spring quarter. This can also include funds needed for summer school.

All students with an unpaid balance must make an appointment with the Business Office to arrange financing. This must be done prior to graduation or final examinations. Appointments can be made from May 18 - May 29.

NOTICE TO ALL GRADUATES:

Students must have their accounts paid in full to be clear for graduation. This must be done by May 22.

SUMMER SCHOOL CHARGES:

Summer school is on a strictly cash basis and the total bill must be paid on or before the first day of summer school which is June 8.



ALL MEN STUDENTS IN THE DORM:


