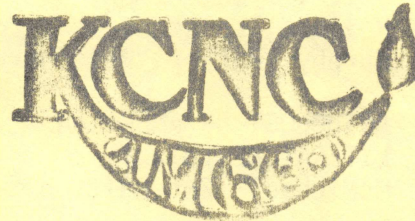

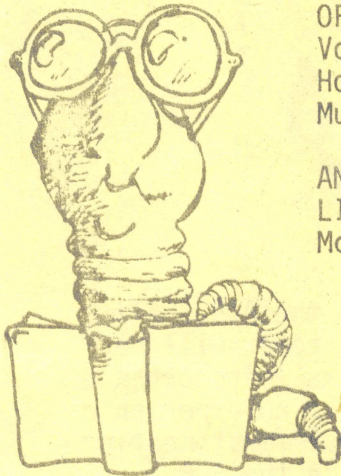

at 9:20 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. daily.

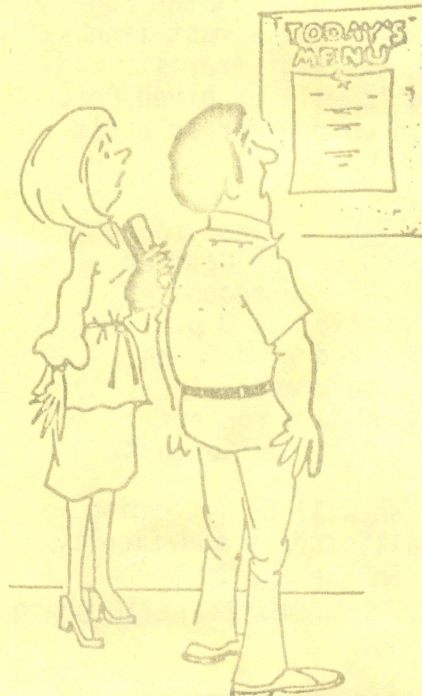
