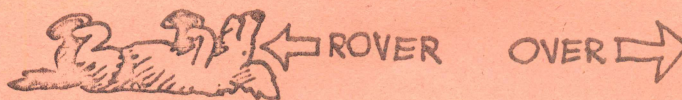

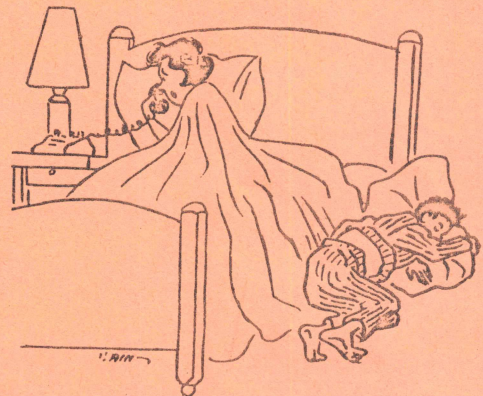
Early Childhood Education Courses Offered in winter quarter:

Evaluative Techniques - Tests and Measurements is a 5 credit course. We use the text most of the universities use. In this course the student learns the techniques of measurement and evaluation.

Creative Methods in ECE - a 3 credit course offered Thursday evening 6:30-9 p.m. Mrs. Clark will be sharing her latest research from the Pope Grant Study on Storytelling, Creative Drama, Games, Poetry and Spiritual Guidance.

Administration of ECE - a 3 credit course very practical - highlighting concepts on how to properly administer a Day Care and Preschool situation.

Practicum I - 3 credits - student teaching in early childhood situations all around the area.
