EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION COURSES SPRING QTR.

Educational Psych. Usually offered in fall, this year offering in spring. It is Psych. 203, and will be offered Thursday evenings - 6:30-9 p.m. It offers the answers to classroom problems, and suggestions and methods of how and what to teach to bring about learning for the student (3 credits).

Curriculum Development. A required course for the Minor in ECE. This course provides background knowledge and practice in writing curriculum for the ECE situation. It is a 5 hour course. Many students have taken this course, and then have become Program Coordinators, Curriculum writers and Directors of Daycares, Preschool and ACE programs in the Elementary School. Educational Psych and Curriculum Development. for all those interested in pursuing Education of any type and every level.

Parent Education This 3 credit course helps prepare the student for parenthood as well as offers helps with child rearing practices, discipline and the parent's role in assisting his/her offspring with education. The course is geared particularly to the first 5 years of life which are of course the most crucial. This is a very practical course for young marrieds, and those who have small children as well as students who are looking forward to marriage and family life.

Practicum II A 3 credit course following Practicum I - it allows the student teacher to try teaching for 3 weeks at the end of the course. This is also part of the requirements for the fulfillment of the Minor in ECE.
