SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES! The General Council of the Assemblies of God is offering four scholarships to Northwest College students for the 1982-83 academic year. The criteria for all four is listed below.

- Elsie Peters Scholarship for Deaf Ministry students--\$250 per year--student must be preparing for deaf ministry.
- (2) National Jewish Committee Scholarship for Jewish students--\$500 per year-student must be a Jr. or Sr., have financial need, and plan to go into the A/G ministry--Ministerial internship of student should be connected with ministry to a Jewish evangelism program.
- (3) Boyer Foundation Scholarship for American Indian students—scholarship to cover tuition, fees, and books of a student—student must be a Jr. or Sr., be interested in missionary service after college graduation.
- (4) Scholarship for Black Students--\$500 per year maximum award--student should be a Jr. or Sr., plan to go into A/G ministry.

Others will be allowed to succeed in making great sums of money, or having a legacy left to them or in having luxuries, but God may supply you daily, because He wants you to have something far better than gold, and that is a helpless dependence on Him, that He may have the privilege of providing your needs day by day out of the unseen treasury.

The Lord may let others be honored, and put forward, and keep you hid away in obscurity, because' He wants to produce some choice, fragrant fruit for His coming glory, which can only be produced in the shade.

God will let others be great, but keep you small. He will let others do a work for Him, and get the credit for it, but He will make you work and toil on without knowing how much you are doing; and then to make your work still more precious. He will let others get the credit for the work which you have done, and this will make your reward ten times greater when Jesus comes. The Holy Spirit will put a strict watch on you, with a jealous love, and will rebuke you for little words and feelings or for wasting your time, which other Christians never seem distressed over.
