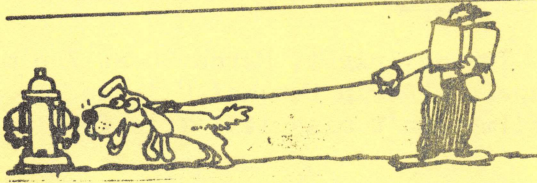
Prayer Emphasis meets Monday, March 29 at 7 p.m. in the chapel. Join us as we start the quarter off with prayer for our school.
