DO YOU HAVE AN UNPAID BALANCE ON YOUR ACCOUNT?

If so, unless it will be paid in full on or before May 28, you must do one of the following: 1) If the balance is less than \$100 and will be paid in full by June 30, you must sign a promissory note. Please see the cashier or the secretary to the Business Manager. 2) If the balance is over \$100, arrangements have been made for a short-term loan from a local bank.

PROCEDURE: Pick up an Information Bulletin and Credit Application from the cashier, fill out one of the applications and bring it in person to the secretary of the Business Manager. Your request will be processed and additional instructions given at that time. This should be done between May 17 and 28. Act early. Only students who have cleared their accounts will be permitted to take finals. NOTE: This loan privilege will not be extended to students graduating with BA or to AA graduates who will not be returning to NC in the fall of 1982.

Would you like to receive summer issues of the Northwesterner? If so, give your name and address to the receptionist in the Admin. Bldg., along with the issues you wish to receive. The June/July issue will contain features on graduation and the August/September issue will prepare you for fall quarter.

Summer School is on a cash in advance basis. There will be no provision for deferred payment. Books for summer school are also on a cash basis.

Interim Housing--Students planning to remain in the residence halls past the closing date (June 4), must obtain and complete an Interim Housing Form from the receptionist in the Administration Building, or from your resident dean. The cost is \$3 per night for double occupancy, and \$3.75 per night for single occupancy. Students must pay for each night in advance. Leaving possessions in a room constitutes "occupying the room" and carries the same charge as stated above. If students are discovered staying in the residences without the above authorization, a fine of \$10 per night will be imposed. Interim Housing runs from June 4 through September 18. Any student choosing to abide in the residence halls during the interim are reminded that they must follow the guidelines/policies of the College or be subject to removal. These guidelines are listed on the Interim Housing Form that the student signs.

Summer School Registration--if you haven't registered for summer school yet you may do so in the Registrars Office any time during office hours until the start of summer school.

Veterans--Are you planning to return to school next fall and desire advance pay on your G.I. bill? Please come to the Registrars Office and sign a form to have your check here in September.

Summer Addresses--Please make sure you have left your correct SUMMER ADDRESS with the Registrars Office. This is very important.

Seniors--Annual Alumni Banquet this Friday, May 28, 7:15 p.m. Your ticket will only cost \$3 in advance, but \$5 at the door. Leave your name, room number and \$3 with the receptionist in the Adm. Bldg.

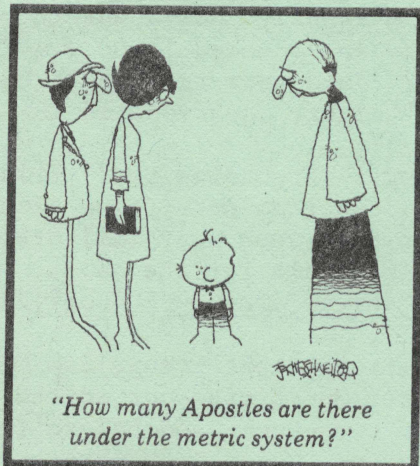
