ELEMENTARY EDUCATION MAJOR. . .

The Northwest College Board of Directors has initiated a process which could result by September 1984 in an Elementary Education major certified by the State of Washington. Grads of the program would have the possibility of initial state credentials as elementary teachers Such credentials would be applicable to both the public and private elementary schools. The College is now engaged in a ten-phase process of program development which is required before state certification can be granted. Therefore, although it is possible that some courses applicable to the program would be offered during the 1983-84 academic year, there can be no guarantee at this point that the program will be offered or that it will be certified. However, the College is moving hopefully towards this goal.


It has been noted that many Northwest College students already go into teaching careers by way of NC's junior college programs and additional professional courses taken at other campuses. It is believed that an elementary education would be attractive to such students particularly for women students who currently do not perceive a vocational goal as the end to their Bible college programs. It is also noted that there is demand for men teaching in Christian schools.

The contemplated elementary education program is seen as an extension of Northwest College's historic purposes of preparing for vocations and professions with ministry potentials relating closely to the Great Commission. Introduction of such a program at this point seems particularly appropriate in view of 1) the secularization of public schools and 2) the current movement among churches to provide private schools with a Christian emphasis. It is believed that students trained in a Bible college program such as that planned would be positive forces in either the public or the private setting.

The following action by vehicle drivers will be greatly appreciated . . .


- 1. "Drive-in" parking NOT back-in.
