HEALTH NEWS RELEASE ...

from the center for disease control in Atlanta. Measles could be carried across the USA by thousands of students on spring break from two universities, Indiana and Purdue. The CDC says all college students, especially those inoculated before their first birthday or in 1963-1967, should be vaccinated now because:

- 1. A vaccine was introduced in 1963, but less than half of the states required immunization in the 1960s.
- Some early inoculations weren't adequate protection.
- 3. As measles cases declined, many children were not vaccinated.

Measels (rubeola) is a contagious viral disease. The incubation period is 7-21 days, the fever, rash appear 3-5 days after the symptoms begin. Complications from measles may be quite serious to fatal, or cause damage that is permanent to the heart/brain or other vital organs of the body. Immunizations can be obtained through the Public Health Department, located here on the Eastside or through your own private physician.
