GUARANTEED STUDENT LOANS - 1982-83



This means you must have the completed GSL application to them by that date. Special Condition Forms for Pell Grant are now available for the 1983-84 academic year in the financial aid office.

Many of you may want to re-apply for a Pell Grant using this form because of unique circumstances which has changed your financial situation (independent students) or your parent's finances (dependent students) from 1982 (more income) to 1983 (less income). JOBS!

There are jobs available off-campus in the State Work Study Program. If you have a defined financial "need" and are enrolled in the Junior College program, you may be eligible for a SWS job. Wages are good.. 19 hours per week during spring quarter.. up to 40 hours per week during the summer! Some examples of SWS jobs: law office clerical, landscaping, carpentry trainee, engineering assistant trainee, office receptionist, etc. See Bev Johnson for more details!

FINANCIAL AID FOR 1983-84 SCHOOL YEAR:

- (1) Financial Aid Forms (FAF) are available now. You should submit your FAF to College Scholarship Service right now for aid consideration— May 1 is the priority deadline for the financial aid office to receive your financial aid information from CSS.
 - (2) Alaska Student Loan (ASL) applications are available. The priority deadline as set by Alaska Student Loan Office is May 15.
- (3) Guaranteed Student Loan (GSL) applications are available. If you and your parents' combined incomes for 1982 are below \$30,000, you can apply right now. We will need verification of your 1982 incomes copies of your IRS 1040 forms would be appreciated. If your and your parents' combined incomes for 1982 are above \$30,000, you must wait to apply for a GSL. We will not fy you in the student bulletin when you can apply. Don't put off applying for financial aid those who plan ahead are rewarded? For application forms (FAF, ASL, GSL), please see Bev or Gwen in the financial aid office right away. Thank you!
