Students should review their finances beofre entering classes in the spring quarter, to be sure they have adequate finances to cover.

- Students enrolling and attending spring quarter must have their account paid in full or will not be permitted to take final examinations.
- The College cannot co-sign for students for summer loans or promissory notes, or any unpaid spring balance (Board of Director's action)
- 3. Students must anticipate and take the initiative to arrange for
- their finances (parents, relatives, bank, loans, etc.).

 4. If a student cannot arrange for adequate finances for spring quarter, they are encouraged to seek full-time employment for the spring and summer months to assure adequate finances for fall quarter.

 (It is not too early to apply for Federal Aid for Fall 1984.)

Any student, registered for spring, but not returning, should officially withdraw at the Office of the Registrar.
