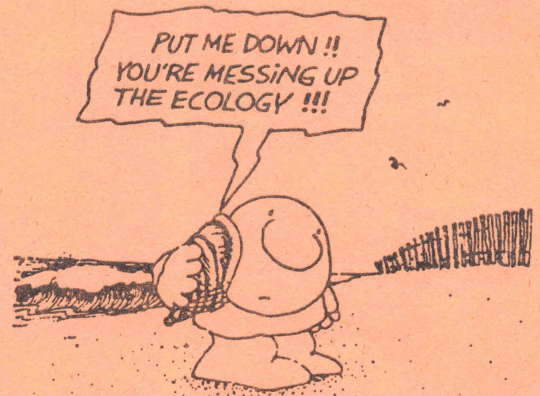

Friday a.m. - Rev. Charles Butterfield, Missionary

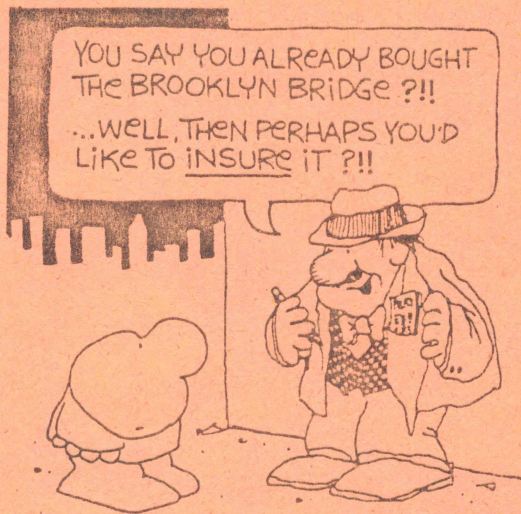
**CHAPEL - MONDAY, APRIL 9th!!! - FREDA KEET**

Freda Keet will be our chapel guest on Monday, April 9. Michael Keen, director of the Radio/Television branch of the Israeli Foreign Ministry, has called her "the most exciting woman in all our nation." She has served as a newscaster on Kol Israel (The voice of Israel) radio for the past 17 years. Her daily newscasts are heard throughout the world.

Miss Keet's journalistic background is extensive and impressive. She was born in Rhodesia (now Zimbabwe), Africa. Her family later migrated to England where she received her formal education. After graduating from the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts in London she received her on-the-air apprenticeship at the famed BBC. Following her graduation, she moved to Israel, fulfilling her greatest dream in life.

Her 17 years with Kol Israel have not been without dangers or excitement. During the 1967 and 1973 wars, Miss Keet reported daily from the front lines in the Golan Heights, the Sinai, and the battle for Jerusalem led by Moshe Dayan.

She was recently featured in two books, The Danger Zone, and The Most Dangerous Man in the World, written by Dan Betzer of Revivaltime.
