

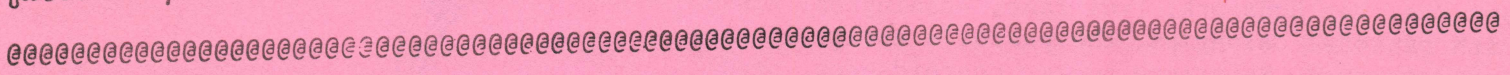

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR 1985-86

- 1) The Assembly of God Division of Home Missions is currently accepting applications for students of Native American, Black, Jewish, or Ethnic descent who plan to enter some type of ministry to persons of their own racial or ethnic background. Application deadline is February 1, 1985. Application forms can be obtained from the Financial Aid Office.
- 2) The Assembly of God Division of Home Missions is also currently accepting application for the Elsie Peters Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to deserving students training to become ministers to the Deaf. Deadline for submission is February 1, 1985. Application forms can be obtained from the Financial Aid Office.
- 3) The Naval Officers' Wives' Club is offering scholarships to dependent sons and daughters of NOAA, Coast Guard and Marine Corp. active or retired personnel. Students applying should be at least Sophomores by Fall 1985 and have cum. G.P.A. of 3.00 or better. Contact the Financial Aid Office.

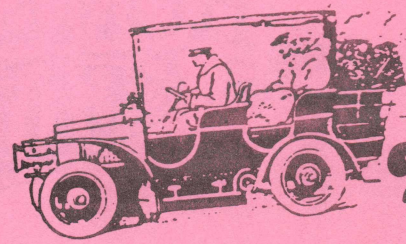
