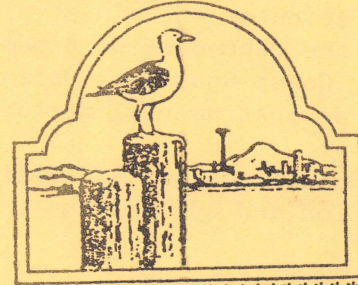

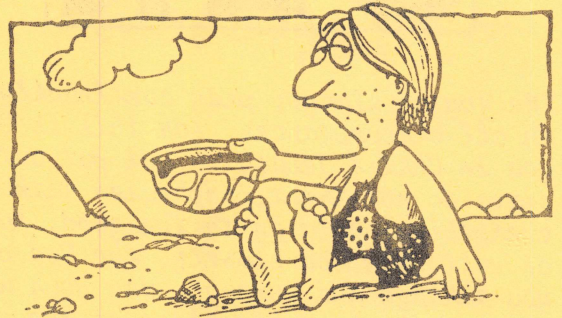
PREPARE FOR NORTHWEST COLLEGE'S FIRST ANNUAL...
