Children's Pastor Age Level Director Minister of Evangelism Christian Day School While the SRS is not an em-ployment office, and cannot guarantee a position to any per-son, it is designed to serve as liaison between churches who need certain personnel and people who are searching for the right

need certain personnel and people who are searching for the right place of ministry. When a church or pastor makes contact with the SRS asking for a particular staff member, several resumes are sent for con-sideration which best relate to the required

Individuals are notified when

their resume is mailed to a church or pastor. After prayerful con-

or pastor. After prayering con-sideration, either party is en-couraged to phone the other to ex-plore further the open position. Applications are catalogued un-der two headings, Available Now, or Not Available Now.
