## STAFF REFERRAL SERVICE

### Providing References to the Church and Christian School With Open Staff Positions

Matching people with opportunities is the purpose of the Mobilization and Placement Service (MAPS). The Staff Referral Service (SRS) provides a very important service to the pastors and members of the local Assemblies of God church.

The goals of the SRS are to help pastors find qualified persons for open positions in the local church and Christian school, and to assist those individuals looking for a place to use their God-given abilities.

### HOW SRS WORKS

The SRS maintains a large file of prospective Christian workers for the following areas:

- Associate Pastor
  - Minister of Youth
  - Minister of Music
  - Minister of Christian Ed
  - Church Business Admin.
  - Children's Pastor
  - Age Level Director
  - Minister of Evangelism
  - Christian Day School
- While the SRS is not an employment office, and cannot guarantee a position to any person, it is designed to serve as liaison between churches who need certain personnel and people who are searching for the right place of ministry.

When a church or pastor makes contact with the SRS asking for a particular staff member, several resumes are sent for consideration which best relate to the request.

Individuals are notified when their resume is mailed to a church or pastor. After prayerful consideration, either party is encouraged to phone the other to explore further the open position.

Applications are catalogued under two headings, Available Now, or Not Available Now.

It is suggested that a contribution be submitted when a contract is successfully consummated to help defray some of the MAPS office costs involved in providing this service.

### WHO MAY PARTICIPATE IN SRS?

The SRS is open to young people graduating from Bible college or a university who are interested in entering some facet of full time church work.

The SRS also serves those who have had several years of experience in ministry, and those who may already be retired, but are interested in changing locations of service.

There is no cost for filing an application. All files are updated once a year to keep them as current as possible.

Persons wanting an application to submit, or pastors who wish to have several resumes for consideration for open positions, should contact the MAPS office.

## Overseas Tentmakers

Modern-day Apostle Pauls can now find places of overseas employment in salaried positions, and serve as a witness for Christ in another culture. This concept of Christian service is called "Tentmaker Ministries."

MAPS now has a direct line to major multinational corporations doing business in countries closed to professional missionaries. You can be a part of this exciting new aspect of foreign missions by applying to MAPS today.

Openings in the following areas are now available.

**Business**  
Manufacturing management, purchasing, quality control manager, sales/marketing, etc.  
**Computer**  
Systems designer, programmer, etc.

**ENGINEER**  
All varieties (i.e. civil, construction, electrical, chemical, mechanical, aerospace, etc.)

**FINANCE**  
Accountant, CPA, financial analyst, auditor, controller.

**MEDICAL**  
Doctor, nurse, hospital administrator, lab technician, etc.

**PETROLEUM**  
Geologist, engineer, construction, driller, rig operator, (any direct experience in this field).

**Skills**  
Electrician, welder, mechanic, machinist, plumber.

**Technician**  
Engineering assistant typically with associate degree (categorized same as engineers).

**Training**  
Technical instructor (equipment maintenance and operation), writer, English teacher, translator.

Foreign language skills are not always required, but a willingness to learn is most helpful. Most openings will require at least five years of career experience.
